
Key findings from interviews-1: different agendas




Key findings-2: Need to change the focus, format, and objective




Key findings-3: They can, but they do not!



Conclusions



Recommendations

For Donor-Funded NGOs:

- learn from the experiences of community-based natural resources management (CBNRM);
- better assess community needs;
- do long-term programming.

For Mining Companies:

- involve community representatives (Community Councils) in their activities
- comply with IFC Performance Standard 6

For Think Tanks and Research Institutes:

- conduct Public Opinion Survey of mining communities;
- perform Basic Necessity Needs Assessment (BNNA) of the areas where the mining companies operate;
- Develop curriculum for government and civil society on communication, policy formation, and good governance

Recommendations

For National Government:

- devolve more power on mining-sector issues to local government;
- consider piloting small projects for some mine operations;
- establish Independent Monitoring Unit (IMU);

For Local Government:

- develop and identify activities that meet the demands of the local population;
- use international best practices such as EITI and PM&E for monitoring mine activities;
- should practice international mechanism such as EITI and PM&E.
