

LiK Study



- LiK Study is a research-based multi-topic longitudinal survey of households and individuals in Kyrgyzstan.
- It tracks the sample of over 8000 individuals from initial 3000 households over time from all regions.
- Data collected at community, household and individual levels ...
- ...on topics of demographics, assets, expenditure, migration, employment, agricultural markets, shocks, social networks, subjective well-being, and other topics.
- The survey was first conducted in 2010 and it has been repeated five times in 2011-2013, 2016 and 2019.

Panel design



- All persons who took part in the first wave of the survey in 2010 are to be surveyed in the following waves.
- Hence, we track individuals, not households.
- In case of within-country mobility, the respective person is to be followed and new household members are also included in the sample.
- Persons joining into an existing LiK household are to be surveyed and tracked.



Sample



- Original survey sample of 3000 households (1750 rural) from 120 communities was drawn in 2010 by stratified random two-stage sampling based on 2009 Census
- Data is nationally representative and at the rural/urban and North/South levels

Development of Questionnaires



- Broad consultations with the extended team and research/development institutions.
- Paper-based questionnaires in 2010-2016; CAPI in 2019
- Interviews are in two languages: Kyrgyz and Russian.
- "Core" modules are asked in all waves; "special" modules added if needed.
- In 2016 the household questionnaire was divided into two parts by introducing an agricultural questionnaire in order to collect detailed information on farming.
- In 2019, a youth questionnaire was introduced to interview individually household members aged 14-17.

Field works



- LiK collected once per year around Fall and Winter months (Sep-
- Private survey company collects data
 - Sotseconik 2010-2013, 2016.
 - SIAR. 2019.
- 80-120 enumerators overseen by 20-40 field supervisors.
- Workload per enumerator is 25 households.
- Field works lasts two-three months.







Lik is a public good & learning tool



- LiK data are accessible for researchers
 - Data are accessible from IZA data platform (idsc.iza.org/lik).
 - Over 100 institutions worldwide has acquired the LiK data for research and teaching.
- Capacity building and learning tool
 - Annual Life in Kyrgyzstan conferences in Bishkek, 2015-2020
 - Three summer schools in 2014, 2015, 2017 (on labor markets; impact evaluation methods, and social cohesion)
 - Research and data workshops, 2012; 2015



Lik-based research opportunities



- Advantage of the LiK in analyzing intra-household impacts
 - Individual panel
 - Decision-making, gender empowerment.
 - Intergenerational links.
- Combination of the LiK data with third-party data
 - Geo-coded climatic, administrative, and other micro-data.
 - Using along with other household surveys, like KIHS.

LiK Study for academic purposes



- The role of the LiK Study for academic purposes is growing.
- As of Oct 2020, 100+ universities, institutions and organizations from 27 countries used the LiK data for research and teaching purposes.
- About 20 scientific academic articles were published in peer-reviewed academic journals, and the total number of all publications of various formats is over 50.

2. Changes in the LiK 2019 wave



Timeline



- The 6th wave of the LiK Study was conducted by IGZ and UCA and co-funded by USAID and AKF.
- Jun 2019: the questionnaire revision.
- Jul-Aug 2019: The tender for data collection.
- Sep 2019: SIAR company was awarded the contract.
- Sep-Nov 2019: data collection preparation.
- Dec 2019-Feb 2020: field works.
- Mar-Apr 2020: the initial data cleaning by SIAR.
- May-Sep 2020: three rounds of data cleaning by the research team.

Structural changes



- A new data collection company, SIAR.
- Shift from paper-based data collection to CAPI.
- Introduction of the youth questionnaire for aged 14-17.
- · Youth questionnaire
 - Modules: life satisfaction; risk aversion; education; nutrition; social networks; civic participation; local governance; employment and migration; political participation; gender attitudes; perception of security; trust.



Changes in questionnaires



- · Household questionnaire
 - · New: food insecurity perceptions; climate change
 - · Revised: shocks (expanded); festivities (removed);
- Individual questionnaire
- · New: Risk aversion; disability status; discrimination; bribing.
- Revised: marriage practices (shortened); Identity (dropped); Values (dropped).
- Agricultural questionnaire
- · New: farm investment.
- · Revised: removed the second AG season
- · Community questionnaire
 - No change.




