#### Criteria for inclusion and exclusion of literature



**Sources - Electronic databases -** Google Scholar, Cyberleninka, JSTOR, and a database of international organizations (ADB, AKDN, INTRAC, IWPR, CABAR asia) having relevant empirical research on CS of Tajikistan



**32 years from 1990 to this year -** primary and secondary sources (Eng./Russ - abstracts)

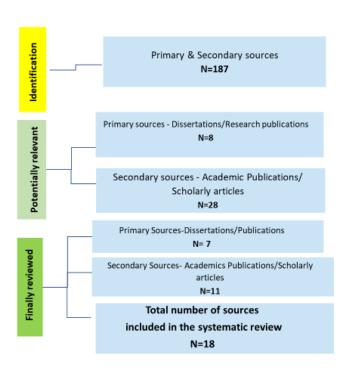


**Keywords** in literature titles (Boolean Strategy): "civil society" and Tajikistan, "associational life" and Tajikistan, "AND NGO, "or NGO" and Tajikistan "non-profit organization" and Tajikistan, "communal life" and Tajikistan "non-governmental" and Tajikistan.



Titles without keywords words; duplicates, news highlights; quotes on CS; CS policy papers; letters to editors; studies not relevant to CS of Tajikistan

# Number of extracted sources for systematic review



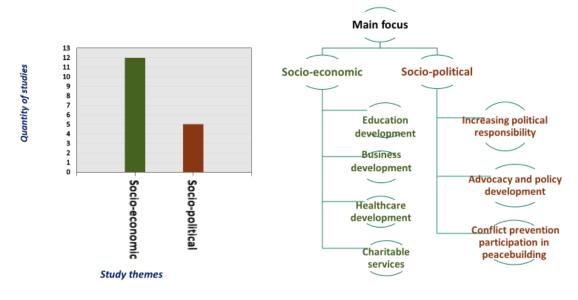

# Findings: Forms of civil society (Heterogeneous forms)



The term "civil society" is ambiguous.

#### 2004. Freizer S.

(CSOs) and (NGOs) can have a positive impact on peace consolidation in BG and Tajikistan; comparative analysis of case studies of two NGOs and two CSOs in each

2007 . AKDN - Yusufbekov, Babajanov, Kuntuvdiy. Large-scale empir. research on CS development in Tajikistan. CSOs play active role in country development especially in sectors of economy, education, and culture. Knowledge on CS activities is limited in all sectors, which makes it difficult to build trust and relationships between government and CS.

2015. Goziev S. Equivalence Mahalla toconcepts of CS in the West. Traditional institution, such as mahalla, is inadequately involved in the development process. Mahalla is open to economic and political transformation, and plays a key role in various political and economic processes. while protecting core values. However, it resists changes during social transformation.



2005. INTRAC - Buxton Ch., Giffen CS development in J., Earle L. Central Asia - Comparative analysis of case studies of NGOs and CSOs in each country. The approach and position of each state was crucial for how CS developed in CA

countries. Unlike other CA countries, Tajikistan's CS sector is largely dependent on donor assistance.

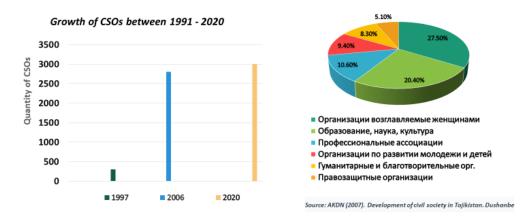
2010. Zharkevich I. ITRAC and SIDA. Investigates role of CS in unstable states. The state works to strengthen trust and cooperation between state institutions and CSOs. CS (in TJ) takes more neutral or positive approach to current regime, in contrast to those states where CS takes confrontational

position in relation to the state.

2018. IWPR. Comparative analytical study on CS of CA - Identify the potential of CS - (online activists), CSO's ability of using media as a tool for changes'. Public relations in media play less effective role in advocating for human rights policies. Media outlets in Tajikistan work closely with state agencies and public authorities, however, passively works with CSOs.

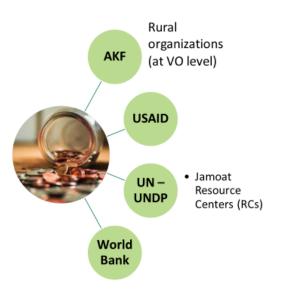
For decades, there has been a huge gap in in-depth research on Tajikistan's civil society in the academic field.

#### Findings: Growth & diverse roles of civil society



Key finding of AKDN (2007) study- CS in Tajikistan made significant contributions to state-building process by actively participating in social services, including the delivery of humanitarian aid and increasing political accountability.

### Findings: Financial status of CSOs



Advanced partnership between CSOs and donors

Democratization of CS practiced better at grassroot level; GOs contribute to CS development

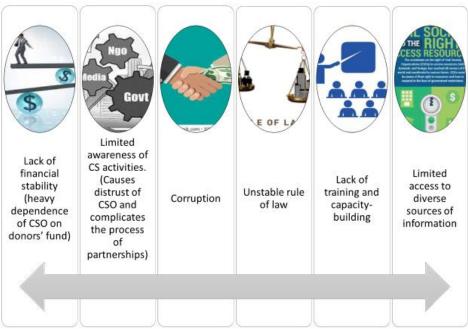
Traditional institutions actively involved in key projects focused on improving the quality of life and empowering people

#### Research Limitations & Recommendations

- Over 30 years only 1 large-scale empirical research conducted by AKDN in 2007.
- Limited methodologies & samples used in previous research on CS in Tajikistan



- CS development & its further practices;
- partnership between CSOs and government
- women's role in CS sector, their participations and engagements in decision-making;
- role of faith-based institutions in CS sector;
- role of volunteers/youth in CS sector;
- CS roles in addressing country's priority issues (social equity, improved education and healthcare, climate change response, employment development);
