The LiK Study

- A research-based multi-topic longitudinal survey of households and individuals in Kyrgyz Republic.
- Six rounds: initial survey done in 2010—repeated five more times (2011 to 2013, 2016 and 2019)
 - Surveying the same households and individuals (panel data);
 - Low attrition (\sim 4.5% year to year)
- The LiK study has evolved (started with 3 modules; most recent one has 5)
 - Household (all waves)
 - Individual (all waves)
 - Community (all waves)
 - Agriculture (2016 and 2019)
 - Youth (2019)

The LiK Study

• Each module is divided into sections covering various aspects of the module topic



- The LiK Study Data is primarily intended for use by researchers
 - Requires registration to access data files
 - Multiple data files that are spread across the years, modules, and sub-sections of each module
 - For 2019 a total of 54 separate files
 - Requires familiarity with data manipulation techniques to be able to extract information
 - Policy makers and those interested in just doing some exploratory work, might find data access daunting
- To allow wider use of the data and make it accessible to those that simply want to get basic information about the various aspects of the study, we are building a data dashboard

Data Dashboard

- Still work in progress
- Currently covers the 2016 and 2019 surveys and most of the modules
- Allows users to query by
 - Module (Household, Agriculture, Community and Individual)
 - Category within Module
 - Year (2016 and 2019 for now)
 - Region
- Output in table and bar-charts; disaggregated by year and region

Overview



- Issue: Poor air quality has been linked to type of fuel source for heating.
- Q: What is the main source of heating in various regions of the country?
 - Query the database
 - → Household
 - → Housing, Assets, Savings
 - → Category: Housing Amenities
 - → Filter: Main source of heating
- How has this changed over time?
 - → 2019 vs 2016

- Issue: Farm investments are needed for increasing agricultural productivity
- Q: What proportion of agricultural households are making investments? What is the investment on? What is the source of funding?
 - Query the database
 - → Agriculture
 - → Category: Farm investment
 - → Filter: Made investment
 - → Filter: Investment activity
 - → Filter: Primary finance source

- Issue: Climate change is associated with greater environmental shocks
- Q: Which regions are likely to experience these shocks (as reported by surveyed households).
 - \rightarrow Household
 - → Climate Change
 - → Category: Climate Change
 - \rightarrow Filter:

- Add previous years, and hopefully 2024
- Ability to see changes over time
- Ability to download
- Translation to Kyrgyz and Russian
